PLEASE READ GUIDELINES FOR EACH SECTION.

- All items for competition must be delivered to the Home Industries Hall at the showgrounds. Drop off times are Thursday 6th 4-7PM, Friday 7th 8:00-10:30AM. All items received after these times will be for exhibition only (With the exception of the Bloke's Bakeoff which may be dropped off to the Home Industries pavilion by 9:30 on Saturday morning)
- Exhibitors may enter multiple items in any class provided entry fees are paid for each item.
- Stewards shall receive and place all items for exhibition.
- The Committee will appoint competent persons to act as Judges and the decision of the Judges will be final. In the event of there only being one entry in a particular class, first prize will be awarded only at the Judge's discretion.
- Prizes may be in the form of Gift Vouchers, gift, cash or as decided by the Committee.
- Most Successful Exhibitor Prizes. In the event of a tie, the winner will be selected on countback.
- No persons, with the exception of officials, will be allowed into the hall while judging is taking place.
- The Committee will exercise all reasonable care but <u>will not be liable for the loss of, or damage to, any item while in their custody.</u>
- The President and Secretary have the power to deal with matters arising on either Judging Day or Show Day.
- In order to facilitate the return of items, competitors are requested to supply a full list of their items on collection. Items may be collected no earlier than 4.30pm and no later than 5.30pm on Saturday 08th November 2025.
 Prize money may only be collected from the Treasurer on collection of exhibits on Show Day.
- If unable to collect exhibits personally, please make provision with a responsible person for collection. All exhibits must leave the pavilion on Saturday no later than 5.30pm.
